

Notes for Authors  
60th Anniversary Special Issue**1. Submission**

Authors should submit their paper *via the web* at <http://journals.iucr.org/a/services/conferenceproceedings.html>. Papers are expected to be submitted in the period February–May 2007.

**2. Manuscript preparation****2.1. File formats**

The manuscript should be prepared using Word, T<sub>E</sub>X or L<sup>A</sup>T<sub>E</sub>X. Authors are encouraged to use the templates available from <http://journals.iucr.org/a/services/authorservices.html> where full instructions are given.

Figures should be prepared in PostScript, encapsulated PostScript or TIFF formats. The resolution of bitmap graphics should be a minimum of 600 d.p.i.

For submission, the text and figures should be provided as a single Word/RTF, PostScript or PDF file. Once the paper is accepted separate source files for the text and figures should be uploaded at the URL provided in the acceptance message.

**2.2. General**

Papers should generally be about five journal pages (~3750 words) and should not exceed ten journal pages (~7500 words). Papers should conform to the general editorial style of *Acta Crystallographica Section A*.

**2.3. Title and authors**

The title should be short and informative. The contact author should provide an e-mail address and a fax number. The e-mail address will be used for editorial communications and despatch of electronic proofs and reprints.

**2.4. Abstract and synopsis**

All contributions must be preceded by an *Abstract* in English. The *Abstract* should be no more than 200 words and it should make no reference to tables, diagrams or formulae contained in the body of the paper. Literature references in the *Abstract* are discouraged but if a reference is unavoidable it should be sufficiently full within the *Abstract*

for unambiguous identification, e.g. [Jones (2005). *J. Appl. Cryst.* **38**, 1–10].

Authors should supply a synopsis of no more than two sentences for inclusion in the contents listing of the journal.

**2.5. Units**

The International System of Units (SI) is used except that the ångström (symbol Å, defined as 10<sup>-10</sup> m) is generally preferred to the nanometre (nm) or picometre (pm) as the appropriate unit of length. Recommended prefixes of decimal multiples should be used rather than ‘× 10<sup>n</sup>’.

**2.6. Figures**

Figures should be prepared using one of the file formats listed in §2.1.

**2.7. Tables**

Tables which are produced in Word should be prepared using the Word table editor.

**2.8. Mathematics**

Displayed mathematical equations which are produced in Word should be prepared using the Word equation editor.

**2.9. Multimedia**

Multimedia additions to a paper are welcomed and will be made available *via Crystallography Journals Online* (<http://journals.iucr.org>). Please contact the IUCr Editorial Office for submission details.

**2.10. References**

References to published work must be indicated by giving the authors' names followed immediately by the year of publication, e.g. Neder & Schulz (1998) or (Neder & Schulz, 1998). Where there are three or more authors the reference in the text should be indicated in the form Smith *et al.* (1998) or (Smith *et al.*, 1998) *etc.* All authors should be included in a full list at the end of the paper. This list should be arranged alphabetically and conform with the following style:

Note that **inclusive** page numbers must be given.
